AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), entitled "An act licensing and regulating the practice of social work; 2 providing penalties; and making an appropriation," further 3 providing for legislative intent, for definitions, for license required, for State Board of Social Workers, Marriage 5 and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors, for powers 6 and functions of board, for qualifications for license, for 7 procedures for licensing, for exemption from licensure 8 examination, for reciprocity, for endorsement of out-of-State 9 licenses and for reinstatement of license; providing for 10 restriction on use of title "licensed professional art 11 therapist" and related titles; and further providing for penalties, for license renewal, records and fees and for 12 13 unlawful practice. 14 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 16 hereby enacts as follows: 17 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family 18 Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, is amended to read: 19 20 Section 2. Legislative intent. 21 The practice of social work, marriage and family therapy 22 [and], professional counseling and professional art therapy
- 24 safety and welfare and to be subject to regulation and control

within this Commonwealth is hereby declared to affect the public

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- 1 in the public interest to protect the public from
- 2 unprofessional, improper, unauthorized and unqualified practice
- 3 of licensed social work, licensed marriage and family therapy
- 4 [and]_ licensed professional counseling and licensed
- 5 professional art therapy. This act regulates only those who hold
- 6 themselves out as licensed social workers, licensed clinical
- 7 social workers, licensed marriage and family therapists [or as],
- 8 licensed professional counselors or as licensed professional art
- 9 <u>therapists</u>. Acquisition of a license under this act shall not be
- 10 made a condition of the employment of a person by the
- 11 Commonwealth or any of its political subdivisions or by
- 12 nonprofit agencies.
- 13 Section 2. The definitions of "board" and "diagnosis" in
- 14 section 3 of the act are amended and the section is amended by
- 15 adding definitions to read:

- 17 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 18 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 19 context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 21 "Board." The State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and
- 22 Family Therapists [and], Professional Counselors and
- 23 <u>Professional Art Therapists</u> under the Bureau of Professional and
- 24 Occupational Affairs within the Department of State.
- 25 "Certified art therapist." An individual holding national
- 26 board certification from the Art Therapy Credentials Board.

- 28 "Diagnosis." The term includes the following:
- 29 (1) A clinical social work assessment, a marriage and
- family therapist assessment [or], a professional counselor

- 1 assessment or a professional art therapy assessment.
- 2 (2) The utilization of currently accepted diagnostic
- 3 classifications by a clinical social worker, a marriage and
- family therapist [or], a professional counselor or a
- 5 professional art therapist, including, but not limited to,
- 6 the American Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and
- 7 Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, as amended and
- 8 supplemented, but only to the extent of the clinical social
- 9 worker's, marriage and family therapist's [or], professional
- 10 counselor's or professional art therapist's education,
- 11 training, experience and scope of practice as established by
- 12 this act.

- "Independent practice of professional art therapy." The
- 15 application of professional art therapy knowledge and skills by
- 16 an individual:
- 17 (1) who styles oneself as a professional art therapist;
- 18 (2) who regulates and is responsible for his or her own
- 19 practice and treatment procedures; and
- 20 (3) whose practice is not affiliated with any other
- 21 practice, health care facility, government agency or
- 22 government-regulated social service agency.

- "Licensed professional art therapist." An individual who
- 25 engages in the practice of professional art therapy and who
- 26 holds a current license under this act.

- 28 <u>"Practice of professional art therapy." The integrative</u>
- 29 application of psychotherapeutic principles and methods with
- 30 specialized training in strategic use of art media, the

- 1 neurobiological implications of art making and art-based
- 2 <u>assessment models. The term includes the following:</u>
- 3 (1) The evaluation, assessment, diagnosis and treatment
- 4 <u>of normal and abnormal cognitive, developmental, behavioral</u>
- 5 <u>and emotional disorders in individuals, families and groups.</u>
- 6 (2) Strategic application of therapeutic art
- 7 interventions, in the context of applied psychological theory
- 8 <u>in a psychotherapeutic relationship.</u>
- 9 (3) Facilitation of visual, nonverbal and verbal
- 10 receptive and expressive communication and implementation of
- 11 treatment plans to help clients improve cognitive and sensory
- motor functions, increase self-awareness and self-esteem,
- cope with traumatic experience and grief, reduce symptoms of
- depression, anger and distress and improve educational
- 15 performance, vocational performance and social functioning.

- 17 <u>"Professional art therapy assessment." The professional</u>
- 18 application of psychotherapeutic and art therapy theories and
- 19 techniques to evaluate, identify and establish plans for
- 20 treatment of individuals, families and groups with emotional,
- 21 mental, addiction and behavioral disorders. The term includes a
- 22 mental health examination and psychological history.
- 23 * * *
- 24 Section 3. Sections 4, 5 heading, (a), (k) and (1) and 6(2)
- 25 and (3) of the act are amended to read:
- 26 Section 4. License required.
- 27 It shall be unlawful for any person to hold himself or
- 28 herself forth as a licensed bachelor social worker, licensed
- 29 social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed
- 30 marriage and family therapist [or], licensed professional

- 1 counselor or licensed professional art therapist unless he or
- 2 she shall first have obtained a license pursuant to this act.
- 3 Section 5. State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family
- 4 Therapists [and]_ Professional Counselors and
- 5 <u>Professional Art Therapists</u>.
- 6 (a) Creation. -- There is hereby created the State Board of
- 7 Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists [and],
- 8 Professional Counselors and Professional Art Therapists, a
- 9 departmental administrative board in the Department of State.
- 10 The board shall consist of [13] 15 members who are citizens of
- 11 the United States and who have been residents of this
- 12 Commonwealth for a two-year period, two of whom shall be public
- 13 members; five of whom shall be licensed social workers, at least
- 14 one of whom shall be a licensed clinical social worker and at
- 15 least one of whom shall be a licensed social worker; two of whom
- 16 shall be licensed marriage and family therapists; two of whom

- 9 professional counselor <u>or licensed professional art therapist</u>
- 10 within the Commonwealth.

- 20 professional art therapists, professional art therapists or art

- 23 (b) Records.--A record of all persons licensed to practice
- 24 as bachelor social workers, social workers, clinical social
- 25 workers, marriage and family therapists [and], professional

- 27 be kept in the office of the board and shall be open to public
- 28 inspection and copying upon payment of a nominal fee for copying
- 29 the record.

- 1 Section 20. Unlawful practice.
- 2 (a) Unlawful practice prohibited. -- It shall be unlawful for
- 3 any person to engage in the independent practice of clinical
- 4 social work, the independent practice of marriage and family
- 5 therapy [or], the independent practice of professional
- 6 counseling or the independent practice of professional art
- 7 therapy or hold himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor
- 8 social worker, licensed social worker, licensed clinical social
- 9 worker, marriage and family therapist [and]_ professional
- 10 counselor <u>and licensed professional art therapist</u> without
- 11 possessing a valid, unexpired, unrevoked and unsuspended license
- 12 issued under this act.
- 13 * * *
- 14 Section 12. Within 60 days of the effective date of this
- 15 section, the Governor shall nominate two professional members to
- 16 serve as the licensed professional art therapist members of the
- 17 State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists,
- 18 Professional Counselors and Professional Art Therapists. The
- 19 professional members initially appointed pursuant to this
- 20 section need not be licensed by the licensure examination
- 21 adopted by the State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and
- 22 Family Therapists, Professional Counselors and Professional Art
- 23 Therapists but, at the time of appointment, must satisfy all
- 24 other requirements of this act for licensure as a professional
