A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of September 2023 as "Slavic Heritage Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The Slavic people immigrated from nations we know
- 4 today as Belarus, Bosnia, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic,
- 5 Herzegovina, Macedonia, Poland, Russia, Serbia, Slovakia,
- 6 Slovenia and Ukraine; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Within Senate District 35, from 1880 to 1920,
- 8 thousands of immigrants from Slavic countries settled in
- 9 Johnstown; and
- 10 WHEREAS, These immigrants were attracted by opportunities to
- 11 work in the mills and mines; and
- 12 WHEREAS, By 1920, 25% of Johnstown's residents were of Slavic
- 13 descent; and
- 14 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth also served as home to many famous
- 15 individuals of Slavic descent, including Mike Ditka, Andy
- 16 Warhol, "Pistol" Pete Maravich, Bret Michaels, Governor Tom
- 17 Ridge and so many more; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Each September, the Johnstown Slavic Festival occurs
- 2 to teach individuals about their ethnic heritage and the culture
- 3 and history of the Slavic people; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The Johnstown Slavic Festival also serves
- 5 exclusively Slavic food and drinks, as well as featuring Slavic
- 6 musical performances; therefore be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of September
- 8 2023 as "Slavic Heritage Month" in Pennsylvania.
